NAVIGATE Risk Assessment

NAViGATE is normally a 'hands on' sailing experience allowing people to enjoy and partake in sailing. However taking a more passive role as a passenger is also a valuable and enjoyable experience.

Water sports are included as one of the exceptions on the list of outdoor recreation that should remain closed. NAViGATE is also a mental health service as much as it is a recreational activity.

NAViGATE takes place on board sailing vessel NautiBuoy which is the only residence of the Skipper and First mate - it is a home as well as a business.

Transport

You should avoid sharing a private vehicle with members of another household as you will not be able to keep strict social distancing guidelines.

Toilet

You should not go indoors unless you need the toilet. Avoid touching surfaces and if you use the toilet wash your hands thoroughly, wipe down surfaces, use separate or paper towels and wash or dispose of them safely after use.

Outdoors

You are only allowed to meet people you do not live with outdoors. The risk of transmission is much less from seeing people outside, while obeying the '2 metre rule', compared to inside.

Food and Drink

You should not pass each other food or drink unless you live together. You should not use plates or utensils that someone from another house has touched.

Summary

At the present time there is no completely risk free way of running NAViGATE. Risk can significantly be reduced by limiting it to two crew, (initially staff members), who do not take an active part in sailing, remain on deck, travel separately and bring their own refreshments.
